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Over \$35,000 of Home Improvements and Volunteered Time Pour Into a Community Residence for People with Special Needs

The Home Depot Foundation Donates Materials and Team Depot Volunteers Donate Time and Professional Services for a Kitchen Facelift and New Outdoor Landscape to ACLD Community Residence in Seaford.

Seaford, NY – August 29, 2018 – There is an old expression that states, *good deeds flow with good intention*. Early this year, The Home Depot Syosset Store Manager was involved in a renovation of a Sayville community residence by Bay Shore’s “Team Depot” volunteers. The manager was so touched by the charitable gesture that he continued down a similar path of giving by taking charge in renovating an ACLD community residence for people with special needs in Seaford.

Starting Wednesday, August 29, 2018, Team Depot volunteers, led by Syosset Store Manager Jayson Drucker, will begin the demolition of the home’s existing kitchen and begin outdoor landscaping to beautify the home. The three week project will include refacing the kitchen cabinets, installing new countertops and backsplash, oak plank and vinyl flooring in the kitchen, living room, dining room and hallway, adding new lighting fixtures and new kitchen appliances. Team Depot will also landscape the front and backyard of the home with new plantings and spreading. The backyard will finish off with a picnic table and benches for the residents, and a new charcoal BBQ.

The facelift was paid for through \$13,000 gift cards from The Home Depot Foundation as well as donated materials, time and labor of Team Depot partners and volunteers. Total value of the home improvement is over \$35,000. The Seaford home is part of ACLD’s residential program.
