ACLD FOUNDATION GOLF OUTING HONORS CIVIC LEADER JIM SKINNER; EVENT RAISES OVER \$156,000

Bethpage, NY/Glen Head, NY, June 17, 2019 – The **ACLD Foundation** held its annual golf outing, a sold-out event, on June 3 at the Glen Head Country Club in Glen Head, NY. On a picture-perfect day, the Foundation hosted 210-plus golfers, game players and dinner guests, raising over \$156,000.

The event honored **Jim Skinner** of **East Meadow**, an ardent supporter of ACLD. ACLD's Chief Operating Officer **Robert Ciatto**, presented Skinner's award, stating, "Jim, we've been working with your company for five years now, during which time you have become a genuine friend of ACLD. You know, at some gatherings, there are multiple honorees who have only a faint relationship with the group bestowing the awards. I want everyone here to know that this is not the case with Jim Skinner. Jim is widely known as a stand-up guy for his work with the Nassau County Boy Scouts as Vice President; Knights of Columbus; Island Harvest; and other civic organizations. Clearly, Jim is an active community member who believes in the importance of giving back."

In his acceptance speech, Skinner stated, "Growing up there were that I just didn't get. You see, across the street from where I grew up was a boy named Richie. Richie and I are the same age; the only difference is that he has a disability. He would always want to play in our games and it was really frustrating. I would come into the house and complain to my parents and they would say, 'There by the grace of God go I.' I didn't get that either. I was too young to understand what that meant, but as I grew up I totally got it." In his closing remarks, Skinner added, "I can remember when I was working for my father [Walter]. He had given a price for some work that we were doing that was extremely low. I asked him, 'What are you doing?' He said this is our way of giving back, to help people like Richie. There is not always going to be a Walter Skinner around to help other people. So, I ask you tonight, if there is something you can do whether it be time, talents or money, to please do so."

Skinner heads East Meadow-based A&C Pest Management, a third-generation family business that has been serving the community for 50 years. He and his wife Mary Anne took over A&C in 1984 and have continued his father Walter's legacy, along with their three sons, James, Collin and Kevin, who work in the business. An Associate Certified Entomologist and a graduate of the Rodent Academy, under Skinner's leadership, A&C pioneered the use of K-9s to seek out bed bugs and rodents. He has served on the board of the Long Island Pest Management Association, among other professional organizations.
